

# State Reportable Incidents & Actions

A safety event for a student must be reported according to federal and state guidelines. A student may have more than one (multiple) Student Safety Records or may not have any student safety records to report.

If a student has committed an infraction that has an **INCIDENT TYPE** that must be reported, then both the **INCIDENT TYPE** and the **ACTION** must be reported, even if the **ACTION** taken is not, by itself, required to be reported. Similarly, if a student has committed an infraction that has an **ACTION** that must be reported, then both the **INCIDENT TYPE** and the **ACTION** must be reported, even if the **INCIDENT TYPE** is not, by itself, required to be reported.

| <b>STATE REPORTABLE ACTIONS</b>  |   |

| <b>Action Code &amp; Type</b>  | <b>Description</b>  |
| <b>00</b> Continuation of Action   | An entry of "00" for an ACTION CODE is acceptable only when the DATA TYPE INDICATOR is "2" indicating that an event with multiple incidents for a single action has occurred.   |
| <b>02</b> Detention  | A discipline action consisting of the assignment of students to a certain area of the school outside of regular school hours (before school, after school, on a non-school day) for two days or the equivalent hours. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Does not include lunch-based detention or any single day detention</li> <li>• May include Saturday school detention so long as the single Saturday school detention is the equivalent to two regular day detention periods (e.g. 1 regular detention is usually 1 hour long and Saturday school lasts 2 hours which would be equivalent to two regular day detention periods)</li> <li>• Two detention days do not have to be consecutive</li> </ul> |
| <b>10</b> Corporal Punishment  | Was administered pursuant to O.C.G.A 20-2-731   |
| <b>20</b> In-School Suspension   | Placed in a state in-school suspension program. Temporary removal of a student from his or her regular classroom(s) for at least half a school day. Student remains under direct supervision of school personnel (Direct supervision means school personnel are physically in the same location as student under their supervision).  |
| <b>30</b> Out-of-School Suspension   | Suspended out of school   |
| <b>40</b> Expulsion  | Expelled  |
| <b>50</b> Suspended from Riding the Bus                                    | Bus suspension  |
| <b>61</b> Assigned to Alternative School for Disruptive Students           | Placed in an alternative school due to disruptive behavior  |
| <b>62</b> Assigned to Other Alternative School for Non-Disruptive Students | Placed in an alternative school other than a Crossroads Alternative School  |
| <b>63</b> Assigned to Other Alternative School by Administrative Law Judge | Assigned by Administrative Law Judge  |
| <b>70</b> Court or Juvenile System Referral                                | Referred to the court or juvenile system  |
| <b>80</b> Other Action for a Serious Incident                              | Received some discipline action (cannot be reported with incident type 24)  |
| <b>90</b> Removed from Class at Teacher's Request                          | Removed from class at the classroom teacher's request pursuant to O.C.G.A 20-2-738  |
| <b>95</b> Physical Restraint   | The direct physical contact from an adult that prevents, or significantly restricts, a student's movement. The term physical restraint does not include prone restraint, mechanical restraint, or chemical restraint. Additionally, physical restraint does not include providing limited physical contact and/or redirection to promote student safety, providing physical guidance or prompting when teaching a skill, redirecting attention, providing guidance to a location, or providing comfort.<br>(Board Rule 160-5-1-.35 SECLUSION AND RESTRAINT FOR ALL STUDENTS)  |

**REMINDER:** Federal requirements mandate reporting student safety incidents for students age 3 through 21 ('PK' – '12') who were subject to any kind of disciplinary action during the school year. This includes three (3) year old SpEd 'PK' students.
